

2019-2020 ACCOMPLISMENTS

CHEYENNE AREA

DEFEATED OIL AND GAS "SPOT ZONING" APPLICATION

MK Investments/Wyodak proposed to rezone 40 acres on the south side of Four Mile Road from Agricultural to Light Industrial for oil and gas equipment staging areas. This measure was defeated by CALC and our members in a recent planning and zoning meeting.

ENSURED PUBLIC NOTICE FOR PIPELINE CONSTRUCTION

Laramie County's new 2019 Land Use Regulations would have streamlined the process for construction of energy pipelines without notification of landowners within 1,500 feet. CALC Intervened with the planning and zoning commission to protect this measure in the new regulations.

SUPPORTED CHANGES TO COMMERCIAL OILFIELD WASTE REGULATIONS TO PROTECT HEALTH AND SAFETY

The Department of Environmental Quality updated the Commercial Oilfield Waste Disposal rules to eliminate grandfathering for older facilities exempt from financial assurance for cleanup. CALC supported these measures and others such as radioactivity monitoring, protecting floodplains and aquifers, and more.

ADVOCATED FOR CLEAN AIR AND RESPONSIBLE PRACTICES

CALC continues to advocate for air quality monitoring in Laramie County and comment on any newly submitted air quality permits from industry to advocate for the safest and most responsible practices for sites that impact our rural neighborhoods.

PUSHED TO PROTECT COUNTY ROADS

CALC has submitted an update to the County's Road Use Agreement which allows oil and gas operators to use county roads for development activities. CALC has constructed a strengthened Road Use Agreement that would also make operators post a bond for roads they use. That way, if roads are damaged the county has funds available for repair and maintenance and won't need to come from taxpayer money.

HELPED SAFEGUARD WYOMING'S MINERAL REVENUES

CALC has written opinion pieces and letters to statewide news sources to oppose tax breaks and royalty relief for the oil and gas industry to protect Wyoming's revenue sources for generations to come.
